Under your leadership, MSU is in the middle of a diversity planning process. It seems contradictory to us that you would hire a person who, while supporting women in STEM fields, has performed in ways that have mobilized members of Northwestern University's community to make numerous demands regarding The Graduate School (which she leads), including demands that she be removed from office.

Given the current diversity planning at MSU, we expect that you have made it clear to Dr. Woodruff that she will have to demonstrate leadership in transforming MSU into a campus characterized by diversity, equity, and inclusion. One that features these elements across the entire institution.

In this day and age, it is of great importance that academic administrators have backgrounds characterized by demonstrated achievements in the areas of diversity, equity, and inclusion.
