

Advisory discusses rating scale

The presidential search and selection advisory committee is expected to approve a rating scale for candidates at its next meeting Friday morning (June 9).

Major discussion at the May 31 meeting of the committee centered on a proposed draft of such a scale which will permit committee members to look at several broad areas of a candidate's experience and expertise. The broad areas include the record-potential as an academic leader, commitment to the land grant philosophy and to equal opportunity, administrative and representational qualities, experience in private and public financing and personal style.

The committee also viewed a draft of a preamble to the job description (completed by the committee early in May). Members made suggestions and the subcommittee in charge of the preamble headed by Lawrence Redd, faculty representative, will report again at the June 9 meeting.

The preamble and rating scale will be sent with the job description to the Board of Trustees for approval at the June 23 meeting.
