Presidential search committee slate readied

The slate of candidates for the presidential search committee is now complete.

Six faculty members, three students, four administrators and five alumni have been nominated for the committee, which will include all eight members of the MSU Board of Trustees, two faculty members, one student, one administrator at or above the level of dean, and one alumnus or alumna.

The six faculty members, nominated by the University Committee on Academic Governance and approved by the Faculty Council, are: Patricia Barnes-McConnell, director of the Bean-Cowpea Collaborative Research Support Program; Ada Finifter, professor of

political science; G.J. Karabatsos, chair of the Department of Chemistry; Bonnie Morrison, associate professor of human environment and design; Henry Silverman, chair of the Department of American thought and language; and Milton Steinmueller, professor of resource development.

Lee June, UCAG chair and Counseling Center director, said there were 39 nominations for the two faculty seats; 24 were for males and 15 for females. UCAG's selection criteria included: the possession of tenure; evidence of distinction; willingness to serve; non-candidacy for the presidency; affirmative action; length of service to the University; appreciation of the University's AAU status and its land-

grant philosophy; one nominee per college.

The student slate includes Charles Krupka of Associated Students of MSU, Daniel Selke of the Council of Graduate Students, and Gene Graham of Student Council.

The administrative nominees are four deans: Gwen Andrew, College of Social Science; Erwin Bettinghaus, College of Communication Arts and Sciences; Richard Lewis, College of Business; and Richard Byerrum, College of Natural Science.

Alumni nominees include: Dave Stone ('70), shareholder and corporate secretary for Raymond, Rupp, Wienberg, Schmier and Stone, P.C., of Troy, Mich.; Janet M. Topolsky ('76),

special assistant to the director, Michigan Department of Commerce; Stella A. Lewis ('77), field executive for the Michigan Metro Girl Scouts Council; Chester Francke ('54), director of placement and college relations for General Motors Corp.; and John E. Griggs ('63), chair of Technology Venture Management, Inc., and partner in Technology Venture Capital of Lansing.

The Board of Trustees is expected to name the committee at its June 7-8 meeting. The committee is scheduled to begin its deliberations the following week, working toward a Nov. 15 deadline for the submission of about three candidates' names to the board.
