

## Trustees to meet next week

A report from the presidential search committee is scheduled as the first agenda item for the July 26-27 Board of Trustees meeting.

The tentative agenda calls for the board to meet at 4 p.m. Thursday (July 26) in the Lincoln Room of Kellogg Center. Scheduled agenda items include the search committee report, public comments, rights and responsibilities documents, and the Clinical Center's nuclear magnetic resonance project.

Trustees will adjourn for dinner and resume at 7:30 p.m. for discussion of the 1984-85 budget guidelines.

Friday's session is scheduled to begin with an 8 a.m. action session in the Board Room of the Administration Building.

Scheduled action items include recommended contract awards for window replacement at University Village and the Union Building; parking improvements for the Pesticide Research Center and Plant Laboratory addition; approval of financing, equipment vendor and a Clinical Center building addition for the nuclear magnetic resonance facility; budget guidelines; and the rights and responsibilities documents.

## Presidential candidate count '80 and growing'

The list of candidates for the presidency of Michigan State University now numbers 80 "and is growing every day," says MSU Public Relations Director Terry Denbow, spokesperson for the search committee.

The committee, which has split into two subcommittees, will meet as a full committee Aug. 14 to begin the screening process of those candidates who have requested confidentiality. All but four of the 80 have asked that their names not be made public. The four are Lawrence A. Ianni, provost, San Francisco State University; Robert Morgan, dean for academic and professional affairs, California School of Professional Psychology-Fresno; Michael P. Riccards, Department of Political Science, Hunter College; and Irvin B. Weiner, Department of Psychology, University of Denver.

## HRI faculty to appeal rejection of panel decision

Hotel, restaurant and institutional management faculty whom a University grievance panel determined in May had a valid grievance against College of Business Dean Richard Lewis over the firing of Don Smith as director of HRI will ask for an appeal following Provost Lee Winder's rejection of the hearing panel's decision.

The University Hearing Board determined in May that the HRI faculty have a valid grievance, contrary to a ruling by President Cecil Mackey that the grievance did not fall within the jurisdiction of the Interim Faculty Grievance Procedure.

In its decision the panel determined that the rights of the HRI faculty had been violated by Lewis because he did not consult the faculty before he fired Smith. The panel asked that Smith's termination be considered a "suspension from duties" until the required review as

specified in the Bylaws for Academic Governance could be followed.

Winder, in a letter addressed to Faculty Grievance Official Mary Brad on June 20, said he does not accept the findings or recommendations of the hearing panel because since the hearing board was challenging Mackey's decision on the grievance the complaint should have been settled before the hearing. Winder said the procedure "deprived concerned parties of the opportunity to participate in the hearing."

**SECONDLY**, Winder said he rejected the panel's decision because, if the Interim Faculty Grievance Procedure were applicable in this case, the complaint has been incorrectly processed and the initial hearing should not have been at the level of the University
