No new students are to be admitted to the program effective Spring 2023. No students are to be readmitted to the program effective Spring 2023. Effective Spring 2024, coding for the program will be discontinued and the program will no longer be available in the Department of Human Development and Family Studies. Students who have not met the requirements for the Disciplinary Teaching Minor in Early Childhood-General and Special Education through the Department of Human Development and Family Studies prior to Spring 2024 will have to change their minor.

Describe impact and explain what accommodations will be made:

The closure of the Early Childhood-General and Special Education MNEL (ZS program) will not negatively impact students. The 6 currently enrolled students will complete their ZS endorsements as planned. No accommodations are needed because currently enrolled ZS students will be able to complete their originally planned programs. No new students will be enrolled. Current ZS students will receive a letter informing them of the closure dates and last date to complete the existing endorsement (Summer 2029, per state recommendations to allow 5 years for anticipated program completion). Information about the new state standards and the corresponding MSU major will be

available through advising offices in the Department of Human Development and Family Studies and the College of Education and will be available on the corresponding websites.

Reason(s) for change(s):

The State of Michigan has approved a new birth to kindergarten teaching grade band certification, and MSU has revised its undergraduate child development teaching major (birth to kindergarten plus special education) to meet the new state standards. The new major has already been approved by MSU and by the state of Michigan. The ZS is no longer needed with the new major focusing specifically on early childhood development and education. Other universities around the state have similarly revised their teaching majors, and, collectively, the need for post-BA early childhood endorsement will be drastically reduced.
